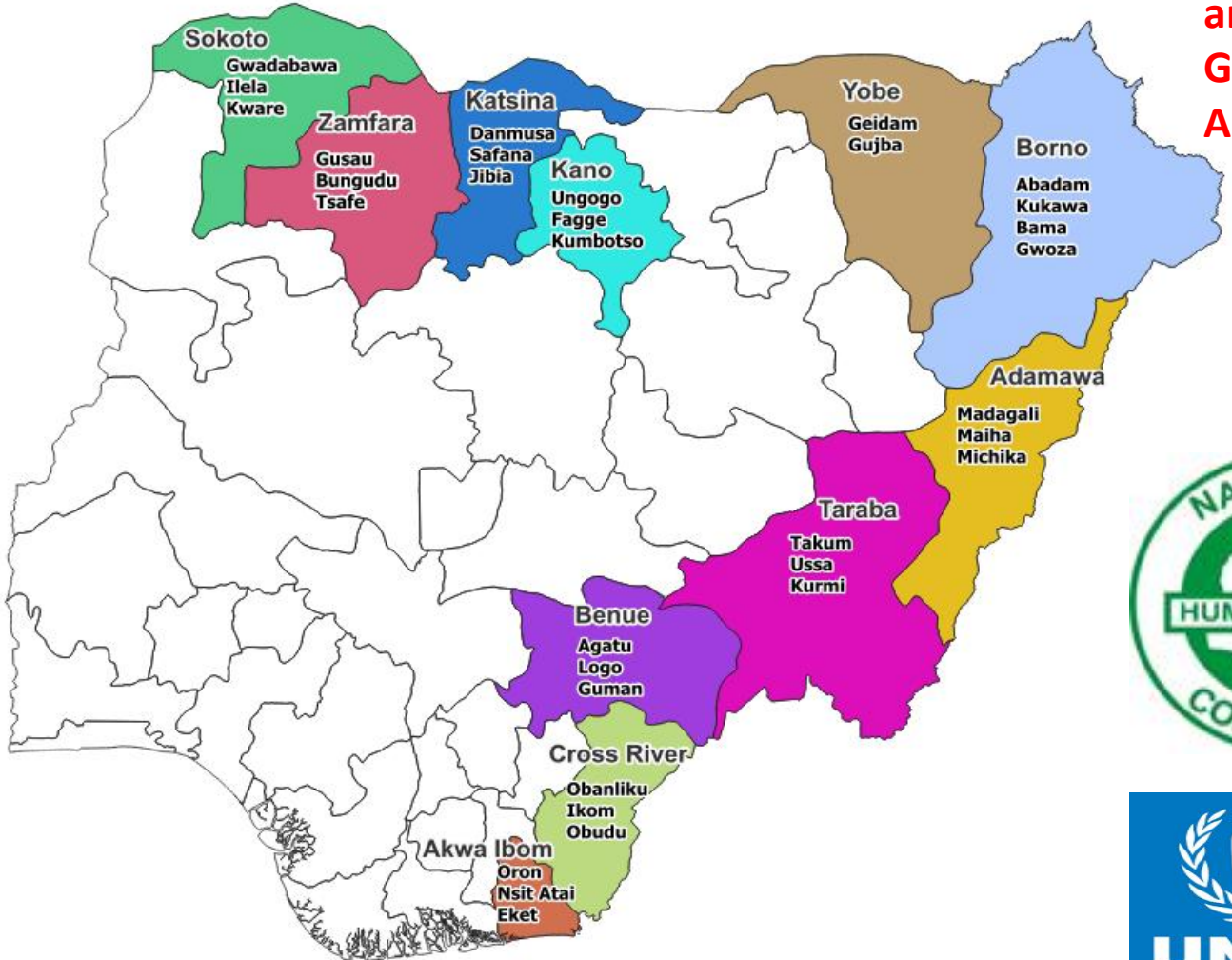

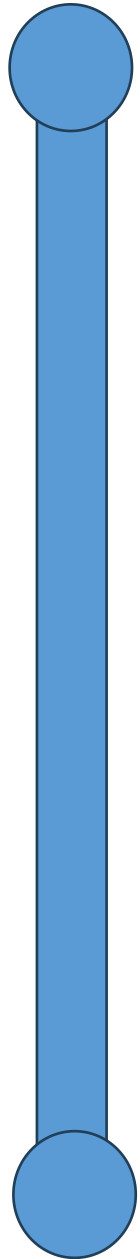

Drivers Of Displacement In The Project States

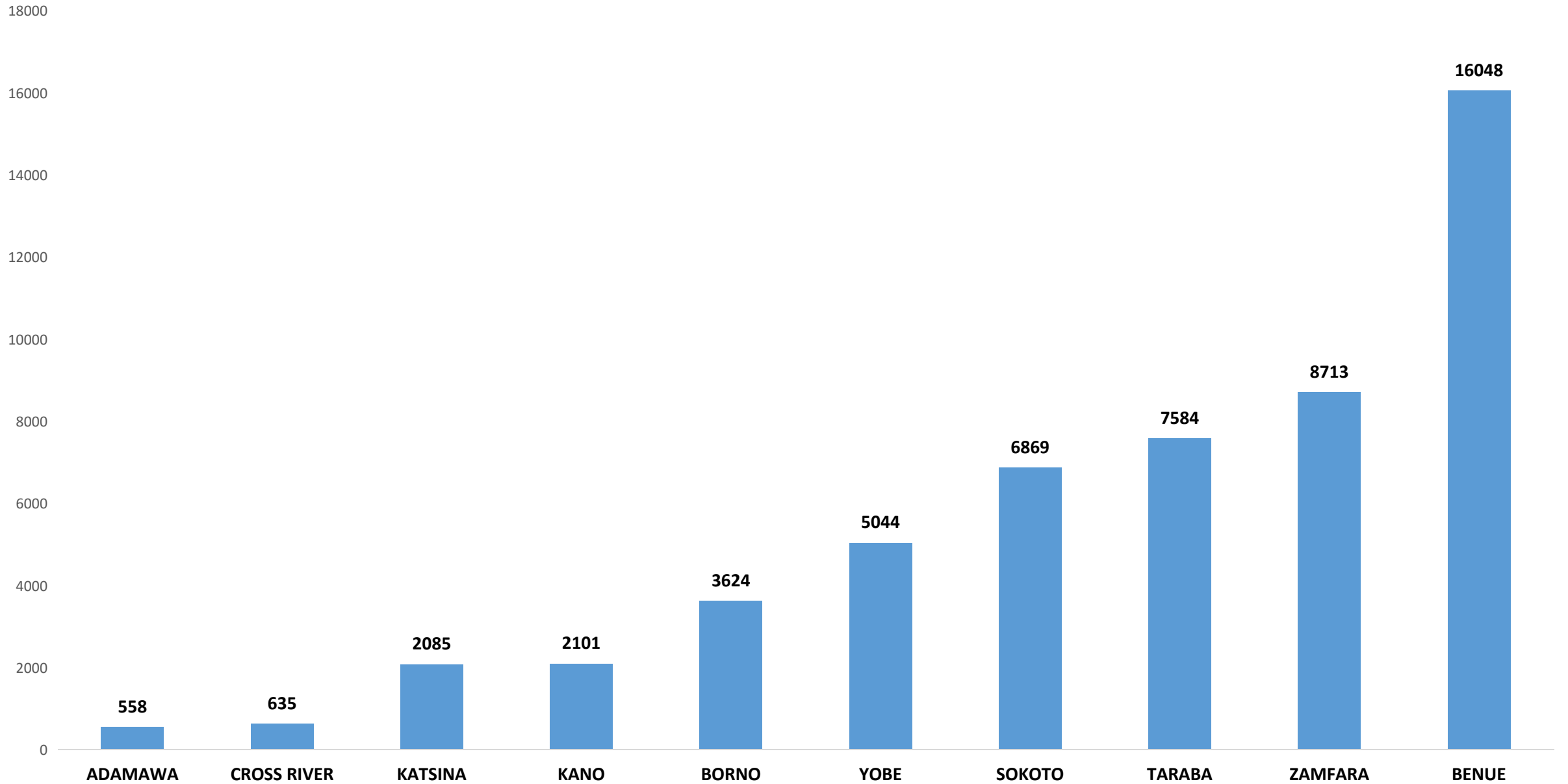
May – July 2025

- Adamawa - Insurgency activities, flooding
- Akwa Ibom - Communal clashes/ boundary disputes, flooding
- Benue - Farmers/Herders /Communal Clashes, Banditry
- Borno - Insurgency activities, flooding, secondary displacement
- Cross River - Communal violence and flooding
- Kano - Insecurity in – Katsina, Sokoto, Zamfara ing states, floods, youth restiveness
- Katsina - Insecurity - banditry, herders/famers conflicts, floods

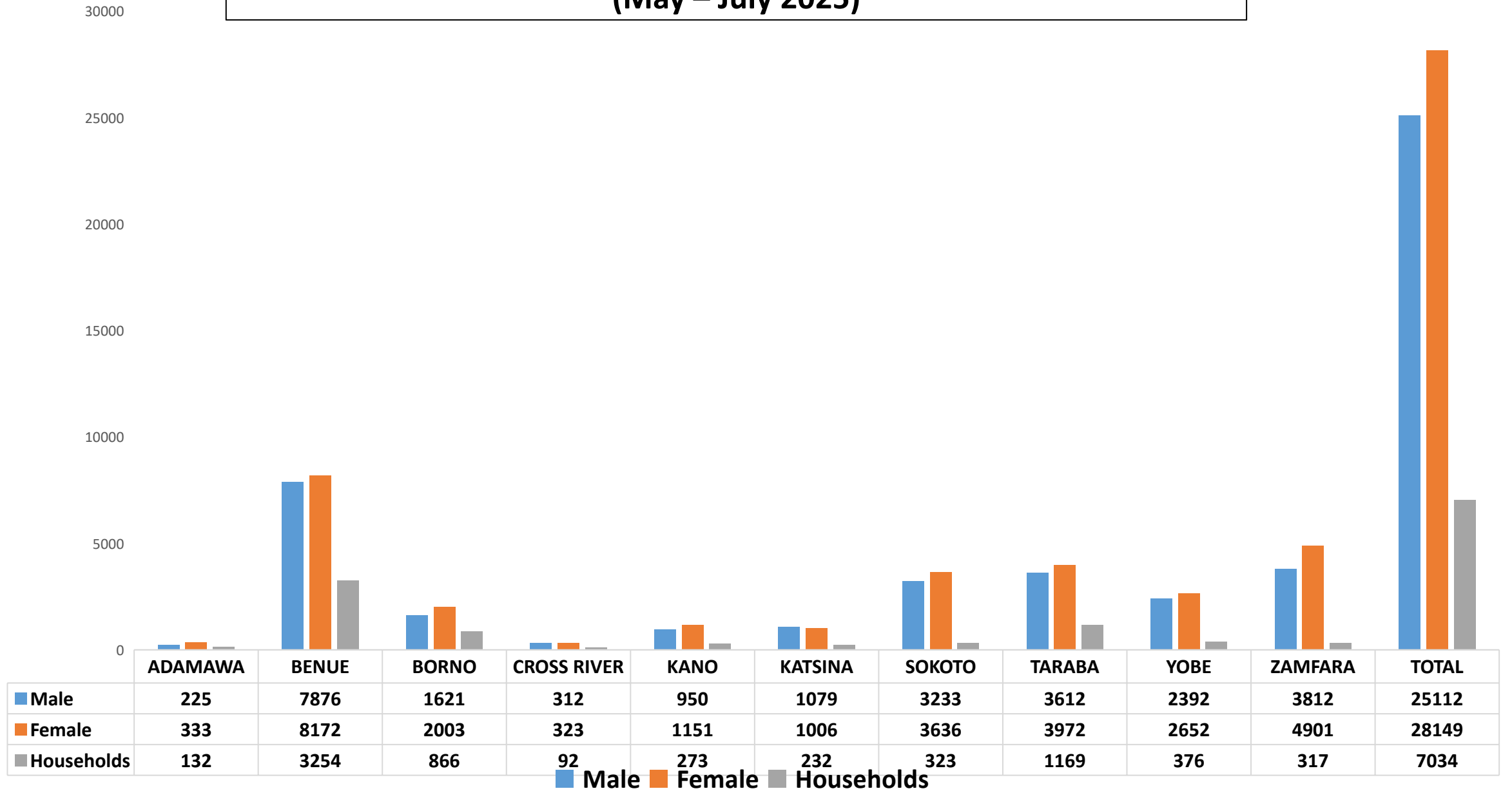
Drivers Of Displacement...

- Sokoto - Insecurity - Armed Banditry, Kidnapping
- Taraba- ethnic violence, Farmers/ Herders conflict, Armed Herders attack, flooding
- Yobe - Herders/Farmer conflicts, Insurgency activities , Flooding
- Zamfara - Insecurity, Armed Banditry, Kidnapping, Flooding

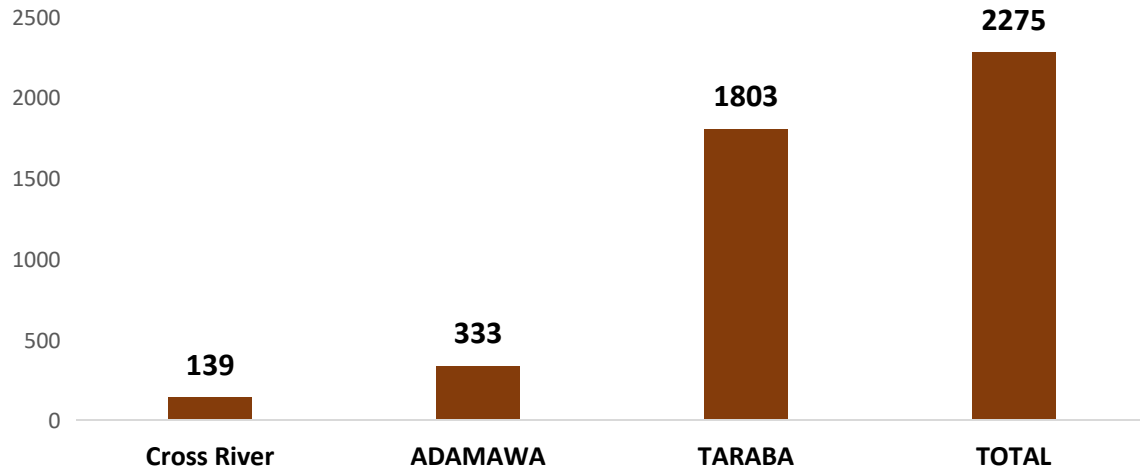


Gender & Household disaggregation of IDPs/FDPs Across Project States (May – July 2025)

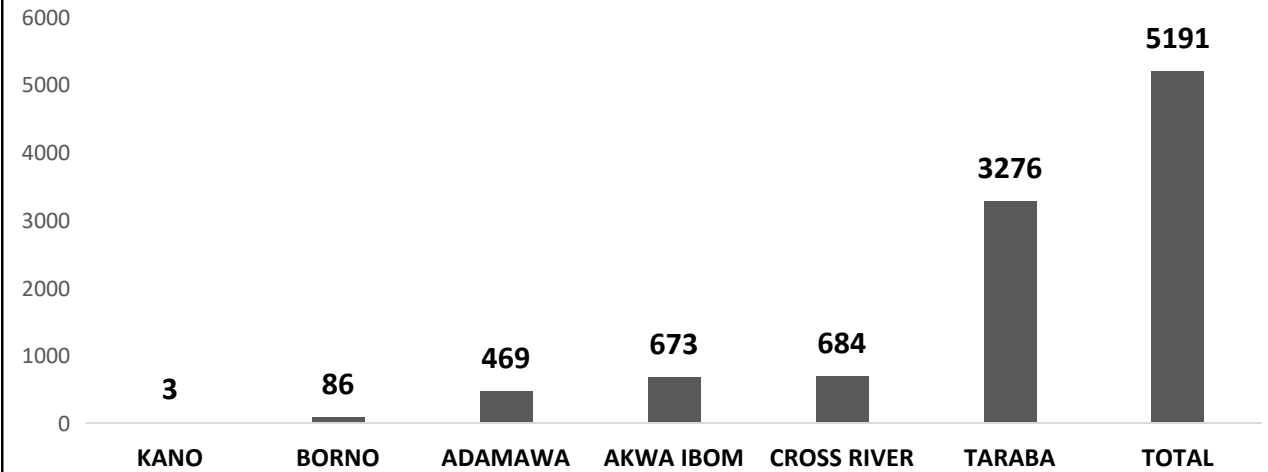

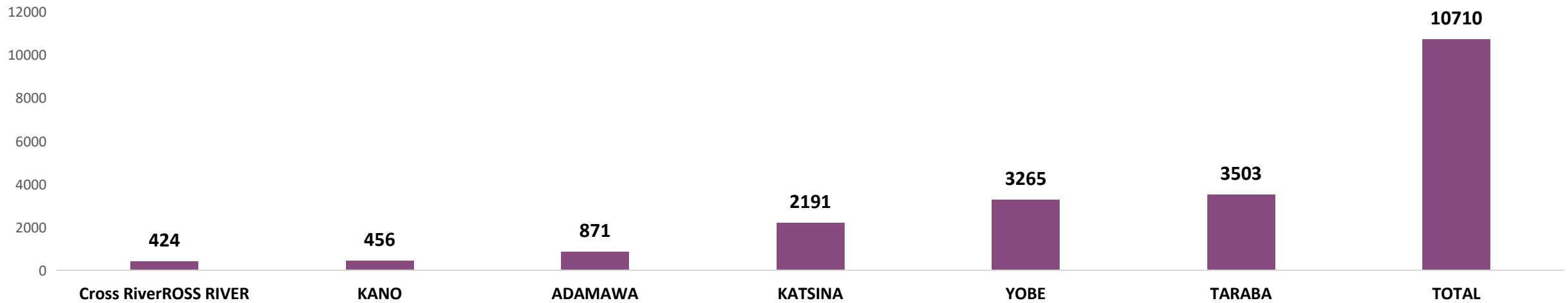

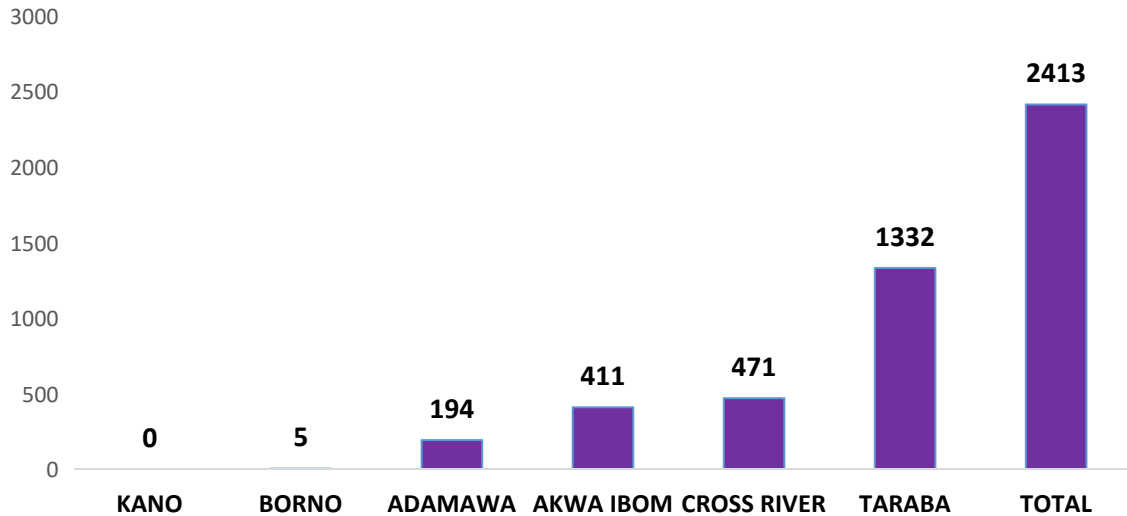

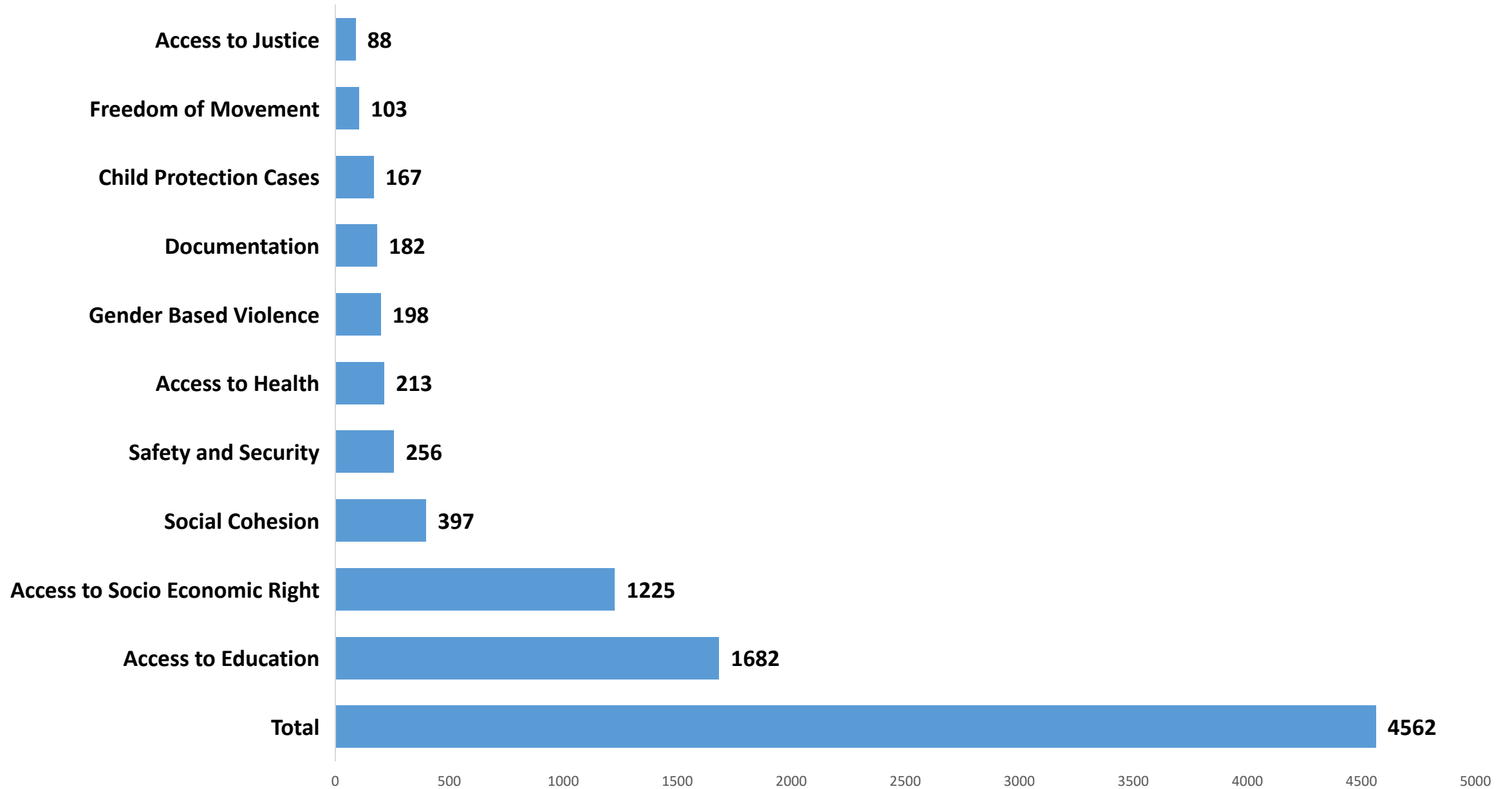

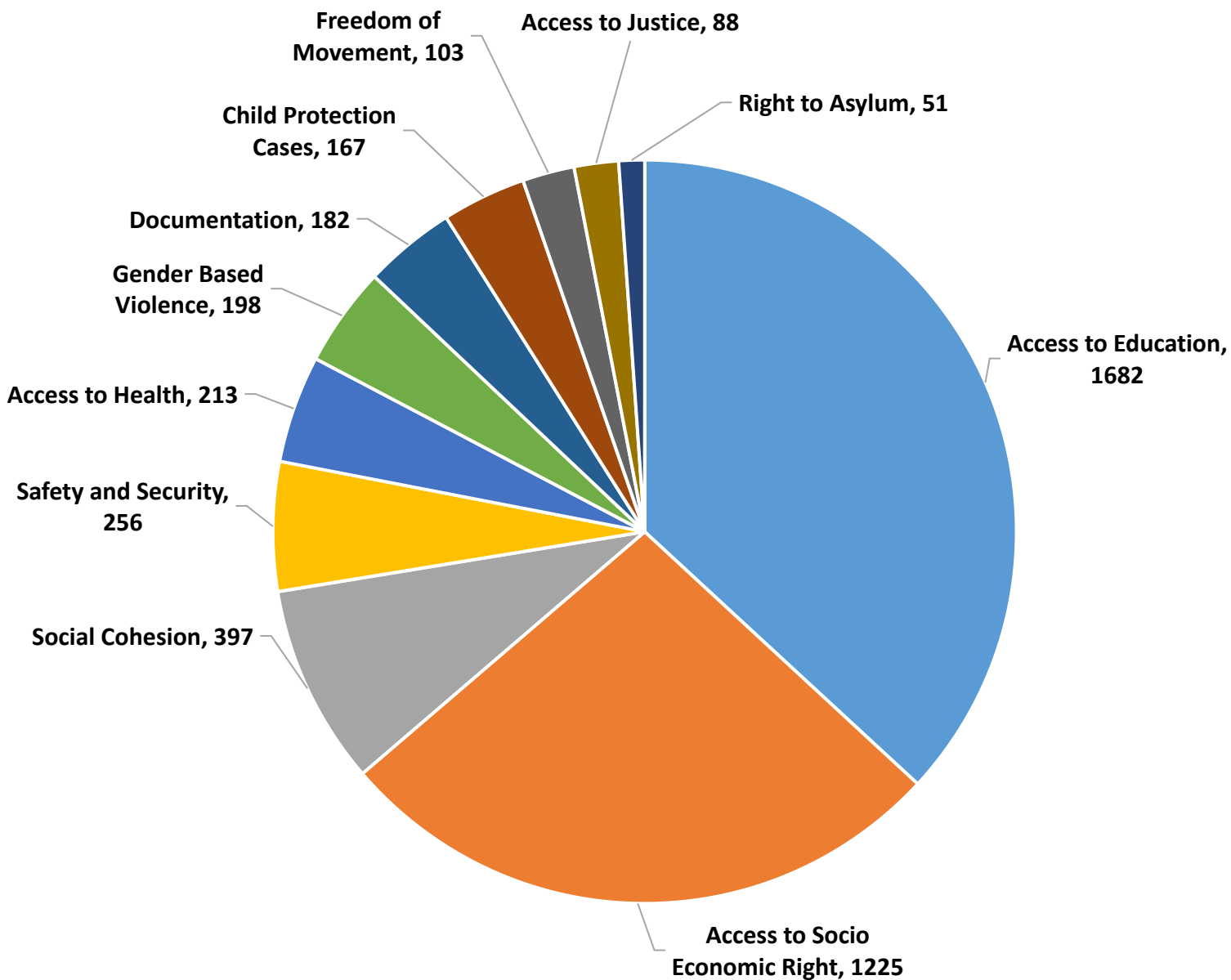

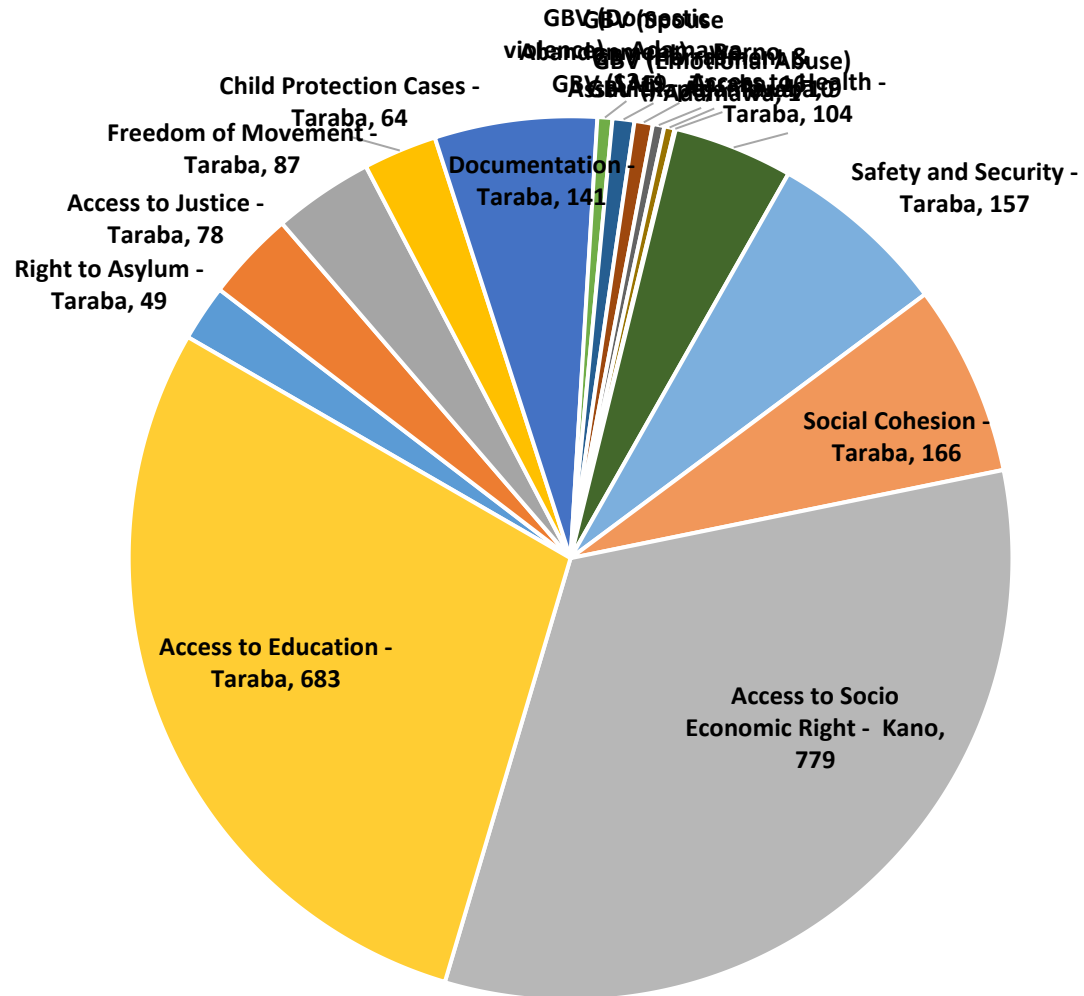

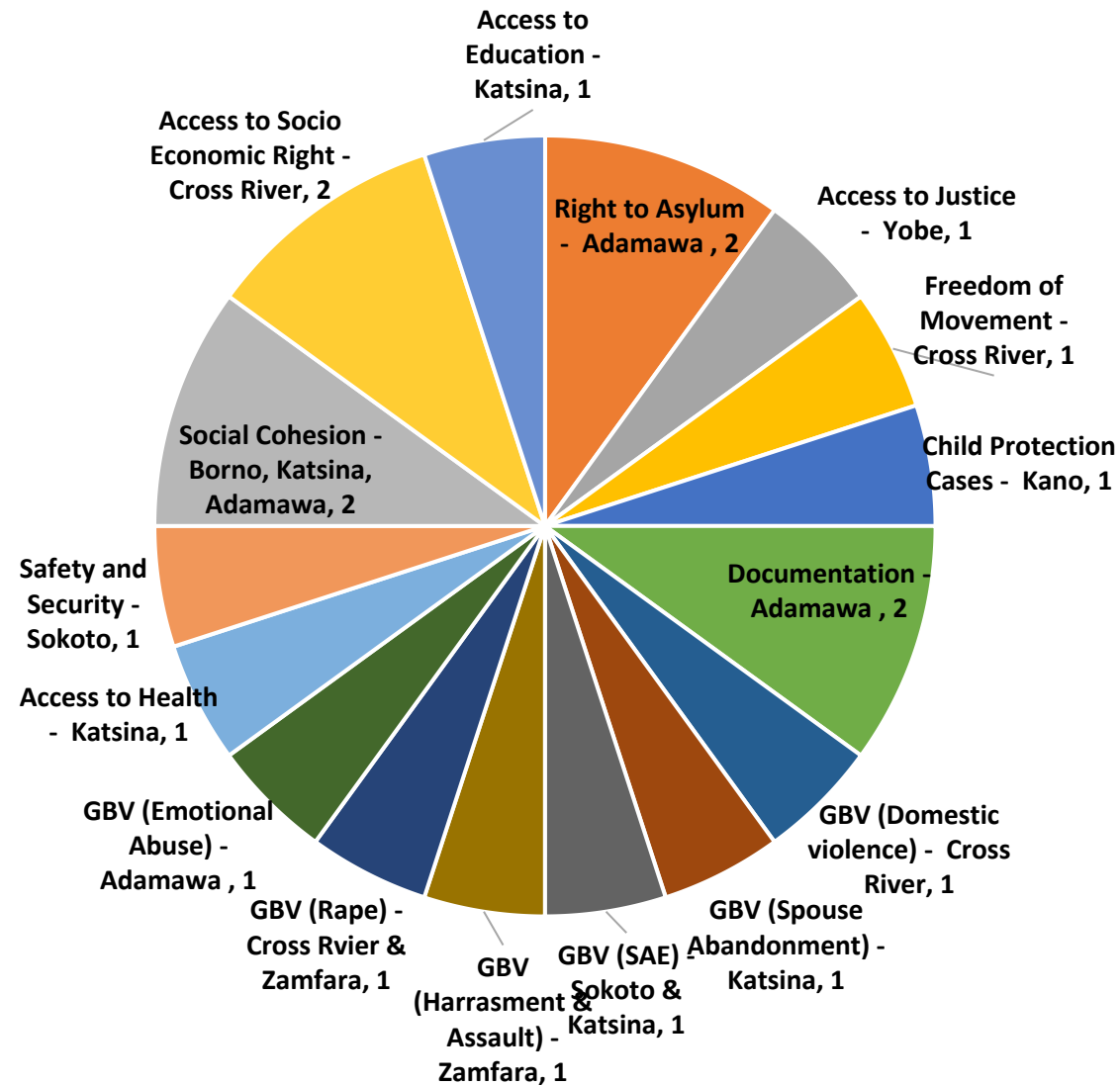

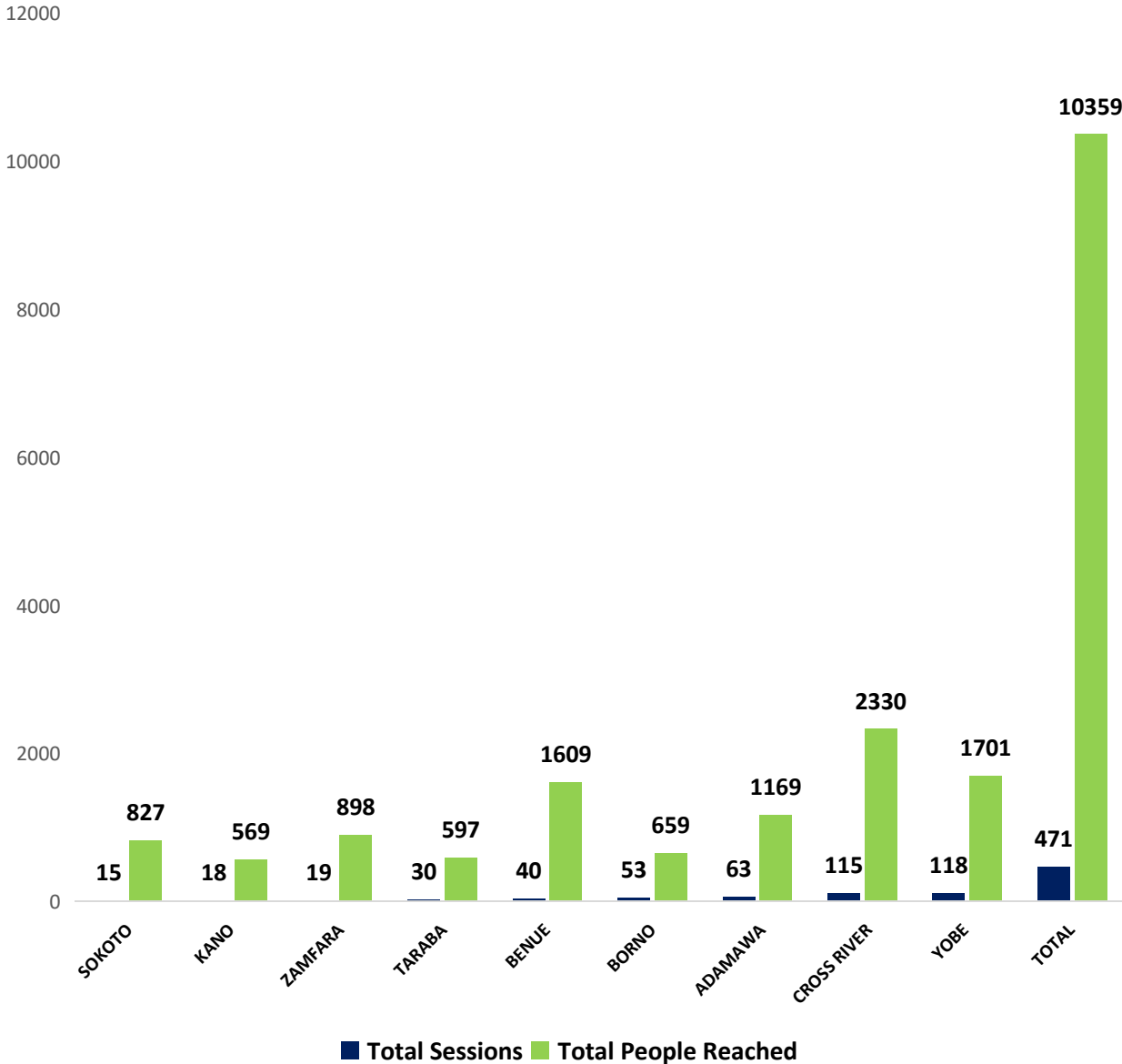


Human Rights Incidents Lowest Occurrences - (States in Numbers)

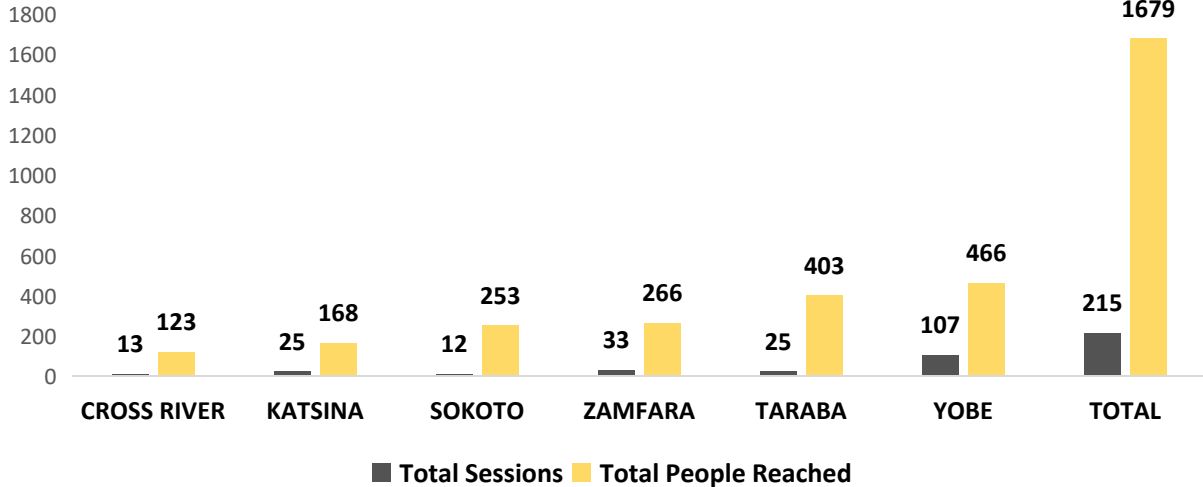

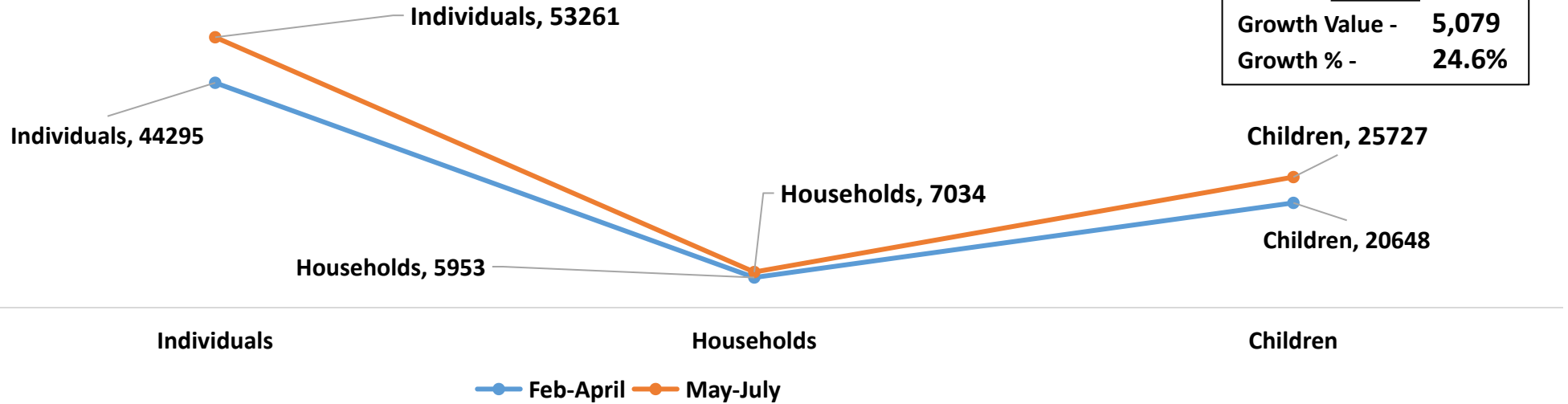

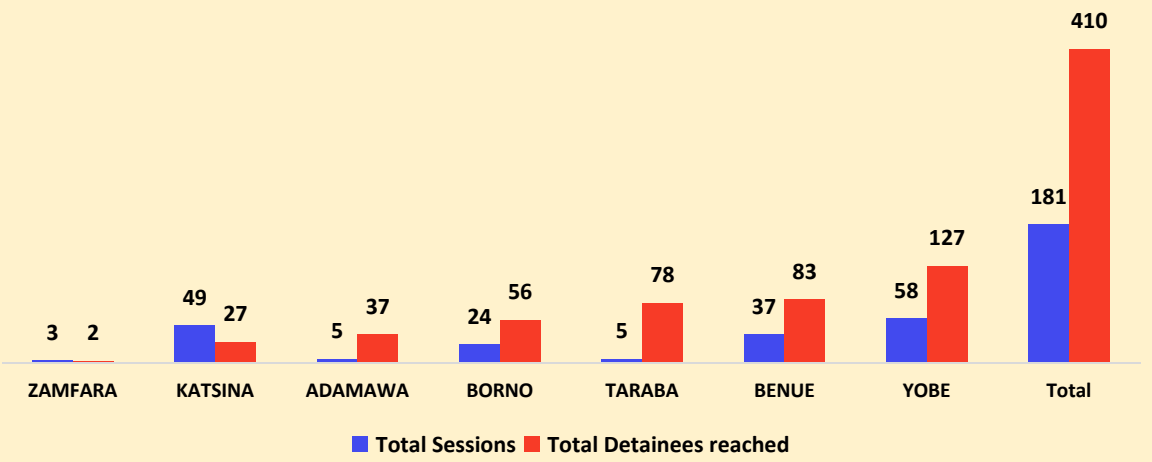

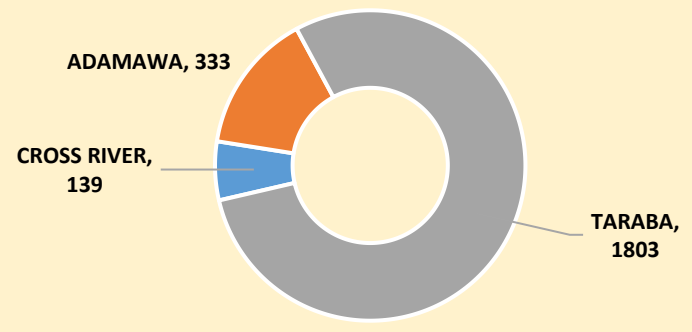
Detention Monitoring Visits To Detention Facilities (May -July 2025)



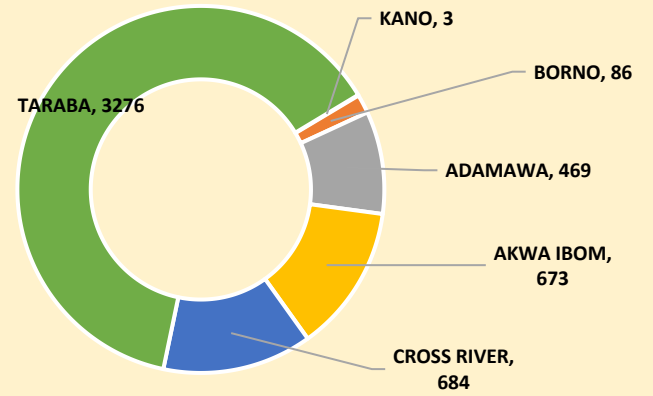
Total People Reached by Community Interventions



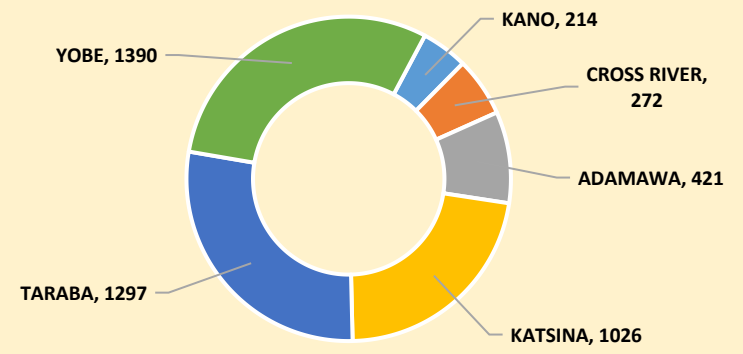
Total Asylum Seekers May – July 2025
